Conversation Starters

- How do you typically celebrate Easter?
- What did you do different this year in light of COVID-19?

Discuss

In a time when we may have an abundance of trials and needs, we can still find joy in knowing God has already provided for our greatest need – rescue from our sin. Through Jesus, we can bring all of our needs to God, but God doesn't just want us to ask for help, He wants us to listen for help. In our circumstances right now, God may be trying to speak to us in some critical areas of life.

• Do you ever take time to just sit and listen to God?

One area God may be speaking to us is regarding our finances or where we place our trust. Some of us have had to make cutbacks or may be furloughed or out of a job. How we respond could tell us if we have been putting more trust in money, a job, or the economy than in God.

"Don't store up treasures here on earth, where moths eat them and rust destroys them, and where thieves break in and steal. Store your treasures in heaven, where moths and rust cannot destroy, and thieves do not break in and steal." (Matthew 6:19-20 NLT)

- How are your finances being challenged right now?
- What are some things you treasure most?
- How would you invest everything you treasure if you had faith in God?
- Are you investing more in the world than in eternity?

It's easy to only think about our physical life as we know it, but Jesus overcoming death gives Christians hope for eternal life. While facing sickness and death, God may be reminding us that we should think in light of eternity, and not make our physical lives here and now everything (and the only thing) there is.

- When you think of life, do you think of only your physical life and not in light of eternity?
- Do you fear death?
- Does fear hold you back from doing anything?

God may also be speaking to us about our relationships. They most certainly look different now than they did. Whether distant from our friends and family or spending more time with them than we're used to, we can choose to be loving and spread hope in a world that desperately needs it.

- What is/are your most challenging relationships right now?
- What fault can you claim in the relationship(s)?
- How can you be more loving and spread hope right now?

Finally, God may be using this time to talk with you about where you are with Him. The same power that resurrected Jesus is available to everyone who chooses to trust and follow Jesus. Through Jesus, we enter into a life-changing relationship with God.
