Conversation Starters

- What feelings were you left with after the message?
- Have you ever thought much about the end times?

Discuss

Many Eastern religions teach that life is cyclical and never-ending, but the Bible teaches that there will be an end to humanity as we know it, often referred to as the "end times," followed by life in eternity.

• How do these two differing worldviews change the way you live?

As described in the Bible, the end times will involve the coming of the antichrist, the great tribulation and the second coming of Jesus. We can get wrapped up in all of the details of what exactly will happen, when, and how, but it's hard for us to really know for certain. The point is that it's coming, it will be bad, but it won't last forever.

"... the antichrist is coming." (I John 2:18 NIV)

"How dreadful it will be in those days for pregnant women and nursing mothers.... For then there will be great distress, unequaled from the beginning of the world until now - and never to be equaled again. If those days had not been cut short, no one would survive..." (<u>Matthew 24:21-22 NIV</u>)

- What struck you about the nature of the antichrist's power when he comes?
- How do you think you would react during the period of tribulation?
- How do the end times magnify the hope that can be found in Jesus?

<u>Jesus spoke about the end times</u> and gave us some signs to be on the lookout for. Many things happening in our world now seem to point to the end times. We don't know that we're in them, but they could be and we should live accordingly. Not in fear or paranoia, but in sober-mindedness to be ready to go through the end times and to be ready for Christ's return.

Signs of the End Times:

- 1. Widespread spiritual deception
- 2. Global eruption of war
- 3. Natural disasters
- 4. Persecution of Christ followers
- 5. Widespread spiritual apostasy
- 6. Internal conflict among Christ followers
- 7. Increasing moral insensitivity
- 8. All will have a chance to hear

"So you, too, must keep watch! For you do not know the day or hour of my return." (Matthew 25:13 NLT)

- How would you respond if you were at the end of time facing Jesus?
- How can you be living now in preparation for facing Jesus?
